

TERMS OF AUCTION Continuation

The authenticity of the auctioned items is guaranteed unless otherwise clearly stated in the description.

The burden of proof for any doubts lies with the buyer. In individual cases, the buyer and auctioneer may agree on an impartial expert whose opinion is accepted in advance by both parties.

Unless catalog holders, auction participants, and bidders state otherwise, they affirm that they are acquiring the catalog and the historical and military artifacts contained therein from the period 1933–1945 solely for the purposes of civic education, defense against unconstitutional and anti-constitutional activities, scientific and art historical research, public awareness, or reporting on current events (§86a of the German Criminal Code). The company Münzzentrum Rheinland, Heinz-Willi Müller, the auctioneer, and its consignors offer these items only under these conditions.

By placing bids on items bearing emblems of the Third Reich, the bidder agrees to acquire these items solely for historical and scientific purposes, as stated above, and not to use them in any way for propaganda purposes, particularly as defined in Section 86a of the German Criminal Code (StGB).

The prices listed in the catalog are non-binding estimated prices. The starting bid is typically around 90% of the estimated price, unless at least two higher written bids have already been received. Therefore, the starting bid may be below or above the estimated price, depending on the amount of written, live, or verbal bids.

Written bids below 90% of the estimated price or below the current precious metal price will not be accepted.

The place of jurisdiction and performance for resellers is Solingen, Germany.

Unusual price developments, such as those currently affecting gold and silver, necessitate an adjustment of the corresponding (minimum) starting prices, as gold and silver may not be auctioned below the metal price according to auction regulations, and the catalog text is prepared several weeks in advance. Any changes to the starting price will be announced at least one day before the auction, and at the latest during the opening call.

Personal viewing is possible before the auction days at the times specified in the catalog. No viewing will take place on the auction days themselves.

Subject to availability, information regarding the condition of the lots can be obtained by telephone.

Auctioneers, consignors, and bidders agree to conduct themselves in a manner that does not impede the success of the auction.

The laws of the Federal Republic of Germany shall apply exclusively. The United Nations Convention on Contracts for the International Sale of Goods (CISG) shall not apply. For businesses as defined in Section 14 of the German Civil Code (BGB) and buyers without a general place of jurisdiction within Germany, the place of performance and exclusive place of jurisdiction for all disputes arising directly or indirectly from the contractual relationship is Solingen, Germany. Should any provision of these terms be wholly or partially invalid, the validity of the remaining provisions shall remain unaffected. The German version of these auction terms and conditions shall always prevail.

The results list will be published online as soon as possible after the auction. It will also be included with the buyer's invoice or sent separately.
